Vocabulary

<u>Maths:</u> number, compare, more / less, 2D shapes, circle, triangle, square, rectangle, <u>Tapic:</u> seasons, summer, autumn, winter, spring, bonfire night, North Pole, South Pole. <u>Phonics:</u> phonemes, digraphs, alphabet, blending, segmenting

English/Phonics

Children will learn to identify individual sounds in words and will continue to develop their sound talking skills. The children will focus on learning individual sounds so they are able to develop their reading skills through segmenting and blending. They will also focus on developing their meaning to simple words through the use of guided reading. They will begin to focus on writing their name in a recognisable way and will be introduce to forming cursive letters.

Understanding the World This term the children will develop their scientific knowledge of how our world changes throughout the year and specifically our school environment. We will focus on understanding floating and sinking and changing states of matter.



Maths

This term the children will be focusing on the numbers to 5. They will explore different ways to represent and compare the numbers. They will be continuing to learn to count forwards and backwards to 10 and using 1:1 correspondence. The children will also learn to identify a range of 2D shapes and begin to identify their properties. They will begin to understand basic position and time using language to describe when events happen. The children will continue to practice their number formation.

Communication and Language The children will explore the past tense and develop their questioning skills to show their understanding of why things happen. Children will develop their confidence in speaking through their performance of their Nativity. Expressive Arts & Design The children will be using their artistic skills to junk model their own boats and experiment with paper folding. They will use their artistic skills to create their own snowy winter scene.

RE

This term children will be learning about people who are special to them and will begin to explore people who are important to members of a religious group.

Physical Development

Children will have the opportunity to involve themselves in activities which support the development of their fine motor skills to develop their muscles ready for writing. They will also take part in PE sessions which will help them to develop their gross motor skills.

Personal, social and emotional development

Our "Jigsaw" lessons this term will focus on celebrating difference. The children will be understanding how we are all special in our own way and where we live with our families.
