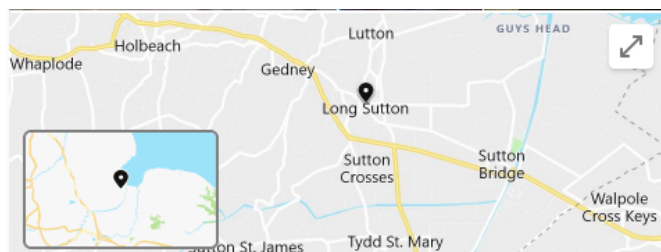

Interesting facts

- Evergreen trees stay green all year round.
- Leaves on a deciduous tree change colour depending on the season.
- Hunstanton is based in Norfolk.
- Other parts of a tree include leaves, branches, bark, roots and crown.
- Some trees can live for hundreds or thousands of years.
- The coastline around the UK is where you can find seaside resorts.
- Places are made up of both physical (natural e.g. rivers, sea, hills) and human features (man-made e.g. shops, funfair, restaurants).
- You might find different animals during the day and night in your garden, including birds, hedgehogs, insects and foxes. Some will be herbivores, carnivores or omnivores,
- The Victorians believed that the sea air was good for you and that sea bathing would make you healthy.

Key Vocabulary

Plants	One of a large group of living things that use sunlight to make their own food. Most plants have leaves, stems, roots and either flowers or fruits
Past	An event that has already taken place.
Present	An event that is taking place <i>now</i> .
Victorian	When Queen Victoria ruled (from 1837-1901).
Sea bathing	Swimming in the sea.
Physical feature	It is a natural occurring feature (e.g. cliffs, sand, sea).
Human feature	This is man-made feature (e.g. pier, shops, arcade).
Branches	A natural parting in the plants trunk (stem)
Tourist	Someone who travels or visits a place for pleasure.
Bark	The bark is the skin of a tree and covers the whole of the trunk
Season	Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter
Crown	It is made up of leaves and branches at the top of the tree.
Location	A particular place (Hunstanton and Long Sutton).
