

## Vocabulary

Maths - fraction, equal, split, whole, groups, share, partition, tens, ones, order, compare, pound, pence

English - full stop, capital letter, question mark, punctuation, conjunction, patterned language, heading, subheading, facts, fiction, non-fiction, photograph

Science - fish, mammal, amphibian, reptile, bird, carnivores, herbivores, omnivores

DT - mechanism, lever, slider, slot, guide, bridge, pivot

Geography - country, city, position, direction, season, weather, full, half, quarter, three-quarter turn, left, right, left, right, forwards, backwards, near, far

## DT

In DT, the children will be considering how sections of stories can be made into a moving picture. They will make different types of mechanisms.

## RE

We will be learning about what Muslims believe about God including the Qu'ran.

## Computing

We will be finding examples of where technology is used outside school. We will also be learning how to navigate around and use the features of a spreadsheet.

## English

We will be continuing our daily Phonics lessons. In English, the children will be studying stories with patterned language, and the Julia Donaldson story Snail and the Whale. They will use this story as a basis to write their own under the sea tale. Towards the end of term, the children will be learning about non-chronological reports. They will explore how they are structured and use this to write their own report about sea creatures.

## Under the Sea

## Science

In science we are learning about animals.

They will learn to identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals

They will identify and name a variety of animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores, and describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals

## Maths

- ✓ Fractions- Finding half or quarter of a shape/number
- ✓ Position & Direction - Describing turns and the position of objects/shapes
- ✓ Place Value to 100 - Counting forwards and backwards to 100, partitioning, comparing and ordering numbers to 100
- ✓ Time - Sequencing events, telling the time to the hour and half an hour.
- ✓ Money -Recognising coins and notes, counting in coins.

## PE

PE lessons will be delivered during Y1 PPA on a Tuesday afternoon and by the class teacher on a Wednesday morning.

Please ensure children are wearing appropriate PE kit for being outside on either of these days.

## PSHE

This term's Jigsaw is Changing Me. They will learn about the changes that have happened to them since they were babies, how changes help them to learn and their feelings associated with change.

## Geography

The children will recap the four countries and capital cities of the UK and the surrounding seas. They will use locational and direction language to describe features on a map, and identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK.
