 Know what countries make up the UK. Can locate the countries of the UK on a map. 	 The Fens, which are also known as the Fenlands, are a coastal area in eastern England. The Fens are part of Cambridgeshire, Norfolk and Lincolnshire. Lincolnshire is a large county in eastern England, with a long coastline on the North Sea. The Fens are very flat compared with the land that surrounds them, and most is below sea level. Without constant drainage and flood protection, the Fens would be liable to flooding. The drainage used to be done via windmills but there are now large pumping stations keeping the water levels at manageable levels. The Fens is the beating heart of British food and farming. Although it covers less than 4% of England's farmed area, the Fens produces more than 7% of England's crops. The Fenland used to cover a much larger space, but the land has been drained during different periods of history. The Fenland is now much smaller, and much of it is ran by nature reserves for conservation purposes. As the land has changed over the centuries, the people living here have had to adapt their way of life and how they earn a living—from Monasteries and fishing to growing and harvesting crops.
