Interesting facts

- The Gingerbread Man story started off as a story about a runaway pancake when it was first written.
- The story of the Gingerbread man is around 200 years old.
- In the story the Gingerbread man was chased by: a little old woman, a little old man, a cow, and pig and then finally the fox.
- The fox tricks the Gingerbread man. First he gets him to jump on his tail, then his back, then his head and then onto his nose.
- When the Gingerbread man is on the Fox's nose, the fox flips hm into his mouth and eats him.
- The story ends with the Gingerbread Man saying 'I am quarter gone, I am half gone, I am three quarters gone and now I am all gone' and after that he is never heard from again.
- The Three Bears go on a walk to let their breakfast porridge cool
- Goldilocks enters the house of the three Bears
- She tries 3 different bowls of porridge and the last one is 'just right'
- She sits on 3 different chairs and the last one is 'just right', but then it breaks
- She tries 3 different beds and the last one is 'just right' and she falls asleep
- The bears return and ask 'Who's been eating my porridge, who's been sitting in my chair and who's been sleeping in my bed?'
- The Bears wake Goldilocks up and she runs away.

Key Vocabulary

Bake	Another word for cooking
Batter/Dough	The mixture that is made before a cake or biscuit is made
Gingerbread	A type of biscuit made with ginger and other spices
Ingredients	The things which are needed to be added together to make something
Oven	Another word for a cooker, a place where food is cooked or baked
Sly	Someone who is cunning and tries to be sneaky and trick people
Porridge	A meal made from oats that is usually eaten for breakfast
Cottage	A type of house
Character	A person who appears or features in a story
Traditional tale	A story that has been told for many years that is known by most people in a country or community
Lent	A Christian celebration leading up to Easter
Shrove Tuesday	The day when pancake day is usually celebrated
