30 hours extended early years entitlement for three- and four-year-olds, and children in foster care

Dear parents / carers,

As you will be aware, the universal free childcare entitlement for three- and four-year-olds was extended from 15 to 30 hours per week for certain working parents in September 2017. From September 2018, this will be extended further to children in foster care where the foster parents meet certain eligibility criteria.

For three- and four-year-olds, parents must meet one of the following eligibility criteria to receive the extended hours:

- Each parent earns, or is expected to earn, a weekly minimum equivalent to 16 hours at National Minimum Wage or National Living Wage (unless in a 'start up' period – i.e. newly self-employed – in which case they don't need to meet the income criteria for 12 months)
- The parent should be seeking the free childcare to enable them to work
- One or both parents are on maternity, paternity, shared parental or adoption leave, or are on statutory sick leave
- One parent meets the income criteria and the other is unable to work because they are disabled, have caring responsibilities or have been assessed as having limited capability to work

You're not eligible if:

- Your child does not usually live with you
- Either you or your partner has a taxable income over £100,000
- You're from outside the EEA and your UK residence card says you cannot access public funds

For children in foster care to be eligible, the following criteria must be met:

- Accessing the extended hours is consistent with the child's care plan, placing the child at the centre of the process and decision-making;
- In single parent foster families, the foster parent engages in paid work outside their role as a foster parent; or
- In two-parent foster families, both partners engage in paid word outside their role as a foster parent (if one partner is not a foster parent, they must be in qualifying paid work and earn a minimum of the equivalent to 16 hours at National Minimum Wage or National Living Wage).

Checking your eligibility for three- and four-year-old children

You can check your eligibility by using the government's Childcare Choices website

(www.childcarechoices.gov.uk) or the <u>Childcare Calculator</u> (www.gov.uk/childcare-calculator). If you are eligible, you will be directed to the digital childcare service to apply and receive your unique eligibility code.

We will need this code, together with your National Insurance number and child's date of birth, to enable us to verify your eligibility with the DfE's Eligibility Checking System. Please complete and return the cut-off slip to the school office by the end of the Summer term, indicating whether you consent to your data being used in this way and, if consent is given, providing the requisite information.

Checking your eligibility for foster care children

You should complete an application form, which must be counter-signed by a designated person within the LA – this individual is <u>name of individual</u> and can be contacted on <u>phone number</u> or <u>email address</u>. You must submit the application form to the LA by <u>the end of the Summer term</u>. The school can provide this form on request.

There is no requirement to check your eligibility using the Childcare Service – it is up to the LA to decide whether you will be eligible for the additional hours on the basis of satisfying the eligibility criteria.
