HOME LEARNING UPDATE

The COVID-19 virus has meant that we have all had to make changes to the way we live our lives and during this pandemic, the health and well-being of all those in our school community must remain our top priority. However, while school is closed, learning should also be continuing but in a different way to which we are all adjusting. For us, we have largely achieved this through our use of online platforms such as Purple Mash and TTRS, and we do thank all our children who have engaged with the activities set, the teachers who have quickly adapted to this way of working, and the feedback we have received from you.

Now that we are entering our seventh week of 'lockdown', we felt it would be an appropriate time to reflect on our current approach. After much consideration, we have decided that whilst we will maintain our use of online learning, we will also introduce a **weekly home learning sheet** starting today. Each Monday, you will receive this via ParentPay with all the necessary resources and web links to support learning at home. You will also find copies of all the materials on our school website. As a school, we do recognise that many households will be experiencing significant stress and uncertainty at this time. Therefore, placing excessive burdens in terms of the amount of work we expect them to complete, we feel, would be profoundly unhelpful. **Therefore, the weekly home learning sheet is a guide of activities you can select to do** as it provides a clear structure to support learning in a variety of ways. We have also added a few sites, which might give you some ideas for activities at home at the bottom of this letter if you want to try something a little different.

As part of the home learning packs, we may have included activity sheets for your child to complete. Whilst we understand that not all families we will able to print these out, we still felt it appropriate to include them, to give you guidance on how the learning may look if your child was still at school. Please remember though, the home learning sheet is a guide, so feel free to adapt it to suit your child's interests or materials you have available at home. If you wish to share any learning with us, we would be delighted to see it. Children can use 2blog in Purple Mash to share their work and photos and we do strongly recommend that children in Reception share their work through Evidence Me.

As we have not been in school together since March 20, we are certainly missing everyone! We also recognise that you will be missing us as well! Whilst Keystone Academy Trust have made the decision that staff will not be teaching lessons via Zoom or other similar online tools, we are hoping to upload regular videos onto our Youtube account to keep in contact with you. We would ask you all to subscribe using this link https://bit.ly/2Sr0gdm where you will already find some videos available to watch. We are looking to add more PE activities, story times and suggestions for activities.

Finally, you will have seen further speculation in the press this weekend, which we do hope has not unsettled you. We have had very little information beyond what is in the news and so I would recommend parents to wait until the announcement from the government which is, currently planned to be, next weekend. This will then allow us to develop our plan and share this with you.





I would also like to remind you that we have started a new initiative with Agape foodbank called the **Long Sutton Food Larder** which is aimed at parents of children at the school. If you register at https://bit.ly/2zE8b0p we can then book you in for a slot to collect 10 free items of food. This is different from foodbank parcels and aimed to give you help in keeping your cupboards full at this very difficult time.
