





Mini beast count

butterfly






bee

Next, think about how you might sort your objects.




Let's do this!



You could sort them into groups of the same colour.


What about sorting them into groups of the same shape?



How about sorting them into groups of the same type?




Which is the biggest group you can make?






Socks!

When the washing is dry, collect all the socks and put them into pairs.




Now, practise doubling numbers to find the total number of socks.
