Key Vocabulary	
Landscape	Part of Earth's surface that can be viewed at one time from one place.
Tropical temperatures	Tropical temperatures are warm or hot most of the year.
Temperate	Areas which are 'temperate' have mild temperatures and moderate rainfall.
Polar	Relating to the North or South Pole.
Region	A specific area that has common features.
Aerial photograph	Taking photographs from high above a particular object or place, such as from an aircraft.
Satellite image	Images of the Earth taken from satellites orbiting the planet.
Climate	The average weather conditions in a place over 30 years or more.
Environment	Everything that is around us, which includes both living and non-living things.

Interesting Facts

- ⇒ St Lucia is one of more than 7,000 individual islands found in a region of the Americas called the Caribbean.
- ⇒ St Lucia is only a small island. It is 43 kilometres long and 23 kilometres wide.
- ⇒ There is a volcano on the island of St Lucia that is called La Soufrière. The volcano last erupted in 1766 and is now considered dormant (meaning it won't erupt again).
- \Rightarrow St Lucia is well-known for its wide variety of birdlife!
- ⇒ The national bird of St Lucia is the Saint Lucian Parrot, which is one of five native parrot species and 157 bird species that live on the island.
- \Rightarrow The entire population of St Lucia is approximately 178,000 people.
