Working Together Team

As a school we're supported by the Working Together Team, based at Gosberton House Academy. WTT specialise in supporting pupils with social communication differences, autism and suspected autism.

This year, WTT have created training sessions which can be requested on demand by both school staff and parents. There are a range of topics covered, including:

- supporting children with a profile of demand avoidance
- autism and emotions
- autism and anxiety
- executive functioning
- autism and eating challenges
- exploring social communication differences
