Statutory Testing

Each year there are national tests that the government expects all children to take once they reach certain stages of their education. It is very important that all children access these tests as they are a measure of their progress through school. Included below are the dates of the tests this academic year so you can ensure that your children are in school for them.



Year 1 – Phonics Screening Check – one week commencing 9th June (Also Year 2 children who did not achieve the expected standard in Year 1)



Year 4 - Multiplication Times Table Check - 2 weeks commencing Monday 2nd June

Year 6 – SATS – Monday 12th = English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling, Tuesday 13th = English Reading, Wednesday 14th = Mathematics (Paper 1 and 2), Thursday 15th May = Mathematics (Paper 3)


Artwork

Parking

Parking is always an issue outside schools as there is a large volume of cars and people. We are suggesting that this year we use a one-way system around the roads near school to help ease congestion. This was used successfully in the past but will only work if everyone chooses to follow it. When approaching the school please use Garnsgate Road, then turn right down Sturton Way, you will then be able to turn right into Dick Turpin Way and the school will be on your left-hand side. Whilst we cannot enforce this, we would encourage everyone to try it to see if it helps! The suggested route is shown below.





Earrings

Please remember that earrings cannot be worn on PE days as injuries from earrings can be serious. Earrings should be removed before children come to school on these days. If children are older and can remove their earrings, they may bring a small, named pot to put them in during the lesson. Please note however, that staff are not able to be responsible for any earrings removed in school.
